Cynthia McCoy, Hazus Excellence Award Winner

“It is really about getting people to understand the possibilities behind the model,” says Cynthia McCoy, Risk Analyst and Hazus POC for FEMA Region III.

The Hazus Program has nominated McCoy as this month’s Hazus Excellence Award Winner due to her exemplary revival of the National Capitol Region Hazus User Group (NCRHUG) and completion of several Hazus projects in her region, including the recent development of the Hazus Toolkit.

McCoy was first exposed to Hazus during a graduate class on land use and environmental modeling while studying City and Regional Planning at the University of Pennsylvania. She joined FEMA in 2012 shortly after graduating and immediately began taking courses at the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) getting both her practitioner and professional certificates in Hazus-MH.

Since completing her coursework at EMI, McCoy worked with Jon Janowiz and took over the NCRHUG in February 2013. The NCRHUG has since grown in size and has become one of the most active Hazus User Groups in the nation.

“During each call, we have presentations about current HAZUS projects, and others which illustrate best practices, and lessons learned,” says McCoy. “We have developed a network, allowing individuals to share their expertise, connect users and resolve technical issues.”

The Hazus Toolkit can be found on the Hazus SharePoint site, or by emailing hazus@arcaspicio.com to request a copy.

Some of its most recent accomplishments include a Region wide training and the development of the Hazus Toolkit.

The Toolkit, which is available to all Hazus User Groups and Leaders, came from a need to codify a consistent HAZUS message in order to speak more credibly about HAZUS projects within Region III.

“It really helps someone who is brand new to identify what they can do with the time and money they have available and within the timeframe available,” says McCoy.

McCoy holds Bachelor's degree in Urban Planning from University of Cincinnati and a Master's degree in City and Regional Planning from UPENN. She lives in Philadelphia.
